✓ Passed a motion by Rep. Peterson to put Public Safety Officer Standards and Training certification and issues surrounding Lake County Sheriff's Office on the LJIC's agenda in April (<i>roll call vote with Rep. McDonald, Rep. Menahan, and Sen. Moss by proxy voting NO</i>)	Dec. 15th - 1:49:00
✓ Passed a motion by Rep. Peterson to have a summary of each advisory council and report (relevant to assigned executive agencies) prior to the next meeting and to have comments from each council and agency on the agenda for the next meeting (<i>voice vote, unanimous</i>)	Dec. 15th - 1:58:55
✓ Passed a motion by Rep. MacDonald to draft two preliminary committee bills on jail suicide prevention -- one based on HB 60 and one based on HB 60 but to apply statewide (<i>voice vote, unanimous</i>)	Dec. 16th - 2:11:17
✓ Passed a motion by Rep. Rep. Menahan to redraft HB 365 (with technical corrections) from the 2011 Session, to revise emergency detention standards, as a preliminary committee bill (<i>roll call vote, unanimous</i>)	Dec. 16th - 3:28:51

More to draft another preliminary committee bill on jail suicide prevention that would be more narrow and specific than HB 60 about communication and coordination with mental health centers, video conferencing, authority to transport to closest secure mental health facility, local control, and also provide specific funding tied to county insurance pool through JPIA and MMIA, a public defender fee, and/or a court fee with Rep. More to confer with David Niss (<i>roll call vote, with Sen. Gallus voting NO by proxy</i>)	Dec. 16th - 3:34:14
✓ Passed a motion by Rep. Peterson to delay any action related to the preservation of biological evidence until the June meeting (<i>voice vote, unanimous</i>)	Dec. 16th - 5:47:06

 - ▶ restitution and restorative justice alternatives to incarceration
 - ▶ obstacles to parole and parole eligibility, policy options
 - ▶ probation and parole violations and policy options for reducing violations
 - ▶ how grievances or concerns by inmate family members are handled, and policy options, including the family council model used in CA
 - ▶ data and information on inmate medical issues
 - Sen. Shockley said he would visit Mr. Harriman, an inmate at MSP, to look at his hernia and that DOC would have the doctor there. Sen. Shockley said he would report to the committee what he finds out
