Update on HB 586 – related to state laboratories 14:45:47 Ms. Wilkinson briefed the committee on a previous study of state labs. (Exhibit 14:46:20 Rep. Kerry White, chair of the advisory committee, gave a brief history on the MSU veterinary diagnostic lab. 15:03:38 Rep. Bedey asked that we post documents to subcommittee website. Informational only? 15:03:56 Rep. White said the advisory committee is looking for this subcommittee to urge MSU to support this issue. 15:06:39 Rep. Hamlett said there was tension about funding Romney Hall during the last legislative session and people didn't want to rock the boat -- but they must keep in mind that MSU is a land-grant university chartered to study agriculture. He said the public is at risk and we are jeopardizing the state's hunting tradition. He said they need to get approval from the regents to build the labs, they are not asking for money. Rep. Jones moved the subcommittee write a letter to the regents expressing 15:10:51 support to allocate the necessary acreage to move forward. 15:12:11 Sen. Salomon asked if it was MSU's land and the regents would give authority to use it? 15:12:31 Rep. White said yes. 15:12:34 Rep. He said the two MSU representatives on the advisory committee voted against writing a letter as they were told it was a conflict of interest and not their place to tell the board of regents what to do. Rep. White said he disagreed and that MSU

needs to prioritize this.
